Fieldwork during the completion of dissertation research

All interviews were conducted in Hindi-Urdu in the northern Indian town of Lucknow in association with NAZ Foundation International, a non-profit organization working for the benefit of male population at risk for HIV-AIDS. Interviews were primarily done with low-

income *kotis* (a sexual minority in India), NAZ Foundations' target population. Some interviews were also conducted with *hijras* (another sexual minority in India, most commonly identified as the third sex)
